



2015-2016 Humane Scorecard Executive Summary

This year saw a total of 12 Bills, Motions and/or Resolutions affecting animals in Wisconsin.

The twelve items introduced this year can be defined as Bills or Motions affecting EXOTIC ANIMALS, FARM ANIMALS, DOMESTIC ANIMALS, AND WILDLIFE.

This humane scorecard is a snapshot of actions taken by legislators. It is impossible to reflect all the nuances involved in moving every piece of legislation thru the bill process and this scorecard reflects our best effort at transparency given the legislative website information.

For example, In Wisconsin a vast majority of the floor votes are "voice votes" with no records of who voted "Yea", or "Nay". <u>BUT</u>, if a legislator wants to go on record they can verbally request that (See Hesselbein & Shankland on AB 433). The majority party can request a roll call vote, if they wish, but this is seldom done.

The legislators' scores (%) were weighted based on their commitment to each animal protection bill in the form of authorship, sponsorship, committee and floor votes. Their votes for anti-animal legislation were also weighted in negatively as well. Every state legislator has the opportunity to sign on as a sponsor of a bill. The question to ask your legislator is: "Will you commit to co-sponsor animal-friendly legislation next session?"

The intent of this scorecard is to not only highlight legislators' sponsorship of these bills, but most importantly to engage WI citizens in the legislative process. If you don't know who your legislators are, link to www.legis.wi.gov

Incumbents are back home and should be available to meet their constituents and their staff is in the office year round to help w/ contacts as well. Challengers can be contacted thru their campaign websites.

- If incumbents score low they should risk losing your vote.
- Will the challenger commit to stronger support of animal protective bills than the incumbent?
- If your legislator sponsors pro-animal bills, thank them for their support and promise your vote.

The only way to protect animals is to elect candidates that will commit to sponsor pro-animal legislation.

AB 308/SB 230

<u>Forcible vehicle entry to remove animals</u> - Under this bill, a person is immune from liability if he or she used force in order to remove from a vehicle a domestic animal or human that they believed was suffering or would suffer bodily harm.

AB 976/SB 728

<u>Items containing ivory or rhinocerous horn - This bill prohibits,</u> with certain exceptions, a person from selling, offering for_sale, possessing with the intent to sell, distributing, purchasing, obtaining, or trading an item containing ivory or rhinoceros horn.

Senate Joint Resolution 112 October 2016 as Animal Safety & Protection Month

AB 333/SB 241

The possession of certain wild animals and providing a penalty - This bill prohibits the possession, propagation, and sale of dangerous exotic animals. Under the bill, dangerous exotic animals are nonnative big cats, nonnative bears, apes and crocodilians. An amendment was introduced which weakened the original bill.

AB 141/SB 97

Household pets in restraining orders and injunctions

Courts may order the protection/removal of household pets from the person subject to the restraining order.

SB 450/AB 487

Animals involved in crimes against animals, unclaimed animals & court orders relating to custody - A stray or abandoned animal may be treated as unclaimed in 4 days although local guidelines supersede and can hold up to 7 days. Payment & petition guidelines established for animals.

<u>Possession of dogs by certain felony offenders and</u> <u>criminal penalties</u> - Fines & imprisonment for serious felony offenders possessing, controlling or residing with a "vicious dog".

Reporting the mistreatment of animals - Immunity from civil liability for veterinarian reporting mistreatment of animals.

AB 433/SB 338

<u>Hunting & First Amendment Rights</u> - Recreational users of public lands and landowners as well are now at risk of penalties under this overreaching law written to protect hound hunters.

AB 719/SB 605

<u>Shining Wild Animals</u> A person may use a battery operated light attached to clothing, the body or mounted to firearm while hunting unprotected animals (Raccoon, Fox, Coyote...) Wild animals are in search of food for their young @ night.

SB 513

Terminology & regulations including inspections, exemptions and fees - Wisconsin agriculture, as w/ all states, continues to whitewash the gruesome realities for farm animals w/ it's use of language. Under this bill, farm animals are officially no longer "animals" they are "livestock". Dead animals or "carcasses" are now "products". Agriculture has insulated itself from the Animal Welfare Act and rather than attempting to meet the concerns of the public they continue to circle the wagons. (not included on scorecard)



Motion to 2015 Budget bill

Senator Tiffany & Representative Czaja introduced a motion into the finance bill to delete the B license requirement for training hound dogs on bears or baiting bears. The motion passed w/ the signing of the finance bill. Consequently, the DNR will not be able to monitor this lethal and unethical, inhumane activity.

Training hound dogs on bears begins July 1st and lasts 60 days. The same Bears are run for hours in the two hottest months of the year. Cubs are often separated from their mothers.

AB 700/SB 542

<u>Wolf hunting & trapping -</u> This bill changes the date for killing Wolves from October 15th to the first Saturday of November if the Wolf is not listed as an endangered species. By moving the date back, hound hunters will have more opportunities to put hound dogs on wolves and this leads to dog & wolf fights. In addition, breeding season begins the latter half of December and the chances increase that a pregnant female will be killed in addition to the increase in fights/deaths of wolves & dogs as wolves can be more territorial during breeding season.
